There's no Such Thing as a Typical Day at Camp Barney!

Campers and staff have a place to be every hour of the day (and night!). But typical day? Well, perhaps sample day works better:

7:15 am	WAKE UP	Some campers get up a bit earlier, some a bit later!
8:00 am	BREAKFAST	We're all together for each meal. Breakfast smells great, even from all the way across camp!
8:45 am	CLEAN-UP, HEALTH CENTER	Some campers get daily medications, others return to cabins to clean up and change clothes if necessary for morning activities.
9:15 am	ACTIVITY #1	Anything from boating, mountain biking, soccer, and horseback riding to ropes courses, theater, arts and crafts, zip lining, and more!
10:30 am	ACTIVITY #2	Anything from the luge, archery, and The Log Roll, to fencing, kayaking, golf, and more!
11:45 am	ACTIVITY #3	Another exciting cabin activity!
1:00 pm	LUNCH	With lots of singing & cheering after the meal!
1:45 pm	REST HOUR	Write/receive mail (and email) & Canteen
3:00 pm	ACTIVITY #4	Another exciting cabin activity!
4:15 pm	ACTIVITY #5	Another exciting cabin activity!
5:15 pm	POOL SWIMMING	The pools are open for a refreshing late afternoon splash!
6:00 pm	DINNER	After each dinner, we announce what activities are open for free play—anything from The "Hurricane" water slide, boating, and arts and crafts to tennis, martial arts, basketball, and more!
6:45 pm	FREE PLAY	Campers have the choice of spending an hour with their cabin, friends in other cabins, or sibling(s).
7:45 pm	ACTIVITY #6	Another exciting cabin activity!
8:45 pm	MILK LINE	Each night before bedtime, campers enjoy warm, freshly baked cookies and milk (or alternatives for special diets). Campers also have a few minutes to say good night to siblings and friends.
9:30 pm	LIGHTS OUT (YOUNG CAMPERS)	Before bedtime, campers brush teeth, straighten up the cabin, enjoy live music or a bedtime story, and talk about the day.
9:30 pm	ACTIVITY #7	Older campers choose a Chug (elective/hobby), anything from theater and sports to arts and crafts, swimming, and more!
11:00 pm	LIGHTS OUT (OLDER CAMPERS)	Supervision is EVERYWHERE for all campers, including in and around every cabin!

Of course, the schedule changes for Shabbat, camp-wide programs, special performances, or out-of-camp adventure trips. As you can see, there's not a typical day at Camp Barney!
