I always get the same feeling when I make that left turn and drive under that sign. That familiar smile comes across my face. You know, the one that almost makes your cheeks hurt it's so big. You drive down the main road and you can feel the gravel rolling underneath your tires. As you pass Lake Louis and the equestrian center (or the Senior Ball Field for those who can recall!) memories of camping experiences start to come to mind. My mind wanders back to my first cabin, growing up each summer, and then finally working on staff as a rover, on waterfront and as a unit head. Perhaps it was the five chocolate chip cookies my kids had at lunch. Or their obsession with living in a tent in the JIT village. Or maybe it was just a perfect day. But something clicked this time. We spent the whole day with most everyone else who made the trip up to Camp Barney, at the lake. There was constant activity at the slide, swimming in the lake, climbing the iceberg and the grownups (so they claimed) shooting across the zip line. This was the beginning of my kids' love of Camp Barney.

We've all had many phases of happiness at CBM. From that first summer, when your eyes are wide open, everything is new and exciting. Next thing you know, you're getting your Seven Year t-shirt and "running the camp" as a J.I.T. Then that first day on staff when your campers show up smiling and cheering, and you realize your true place at camp, to help your campers grow and learn about what makes CBM so special. But this is a different phase, one of a parent hoping your kids will soon love this place as much as you do, maybe more. And that's really exciting.

One thing I know about next year's Alumni Day... now my kids are just as eager as I am!

THE CAMP BARNEY FAMILY COMES THROUGH

On May 30, 2011, Joe Gadd, a horseback staff member from the UK was injured at camp in an accident when a horse he was riding lost its footing and Joe fell to the ground, landing on his back. He was airlifted to Grady Hospital in Atlanta where he underwent two spinal stabilization surgeries. He was moved to the Shepherd Spinal Center and spent 8 weeks in the inpatient program. Joe has "graduated" and moved to an apartment on the Shepherd campus for a 4-6 week outpatient program. After that time, Joe and his mother will be renting an apartment near Shepherd for 3-6 months to continue daily therapy. He is currently paralyzed from the chest down.

It is important for Joe to have his family's support during his recovery. His parents put their lives in the UK on hold in order to be by Joe's side in Atlanta.

It really has been heartwarming to see how many people have helped the family. The Gadds are such wonderful people and have been thrown into a life-changing experience.

Camp alumna and parent Donna Maslia Chimberoff, camp alumnus and parent Tony Levitas, and camp

alumnus and parent Skip Weiland organized a fundraiser for Joe on August 14th at The Old Crow Bar & Grill. Tony and his band, The Helpers, and Mark Michelson and Friends performed and all proceeds from the cover charge went to help Joe and his family. Camp Alumna Karen Edelberg Gold designed and sold t-shirts. It was well attended by our Camp Barney family, both parents and alumni. Between cover charge, t-shirt sales, and donations, they were able to raise over \$6,000 for Joe and his family.

Donna has been raising money all summer for the Gadd family. She has received many generous contributions from our own Jewish community including many CBM families and alumni. The money is being used to help the Gadd family continue to pay their expenses back home while his parents care for Joe here in Atlanta.

The Marcus JCC of Atlanta has also contributed about \$8,000 to the Gadds and is still receiving donations. And the 2011 Camp Barney staff raised over \$2,000 this past summer for the Gadd family. Please contact me if you are interested in making a donation at fran@campbarney.org.

Direct from Israel: New party concept introduced in Atlanta

Refrigerators in Israel aren't just a place to keep things cold. In recent years they have become colorful high-quality photo galleries displaying candid photos taken at simchas ranging from weddings to birthday parties and every celebration in between.

The concept of high quality magnetized photographic mementos is now available in the southeast. **Andrew Levison** (camper and staff 1996-2011) has joined forces with **Roey Shoshan** (staff 2010) to introduce "Mag-nificent" to the Atlanta party scene. The Mag-nificent duo has already provided these small magnetic treasures to guests at a BBYO Alumni event, birthday parties, sorority events, and bat mitzvahs. And with more events already scheduled for the year, the instant photo magnet concept seems poised to take off.

After working with the client to design and customize the frame in the weeks leading up to the event, the Mag-nificent photographers take hundreds of photos of the event in action. Every 30-45 minutes, the photos are developed onto magnets for guests to grab.

"While party guests in Atlanta continue to take party-favor photo keepsakes home from celebrations, the shots are often very staged and require the guests to take time away from socializing to stand in line to be photographed," said Andrew. "Mag-nificent photographers move through the crowd to capture those candid shots – the amazing moments that can never be relived in a photo booth. Guests can just enjoy themselves while our roaming photographers do the work."

"The best part is that the photos are laminated, magnetized, personalized (with a frame designed by the party hosts) and ready within minutes. The guests simply walk over to the giant Mag-nificent Board and grab the photos they want," explained Roey.
