If you plan on picking up your child in Atlanta at the buses on the last day of each session, June 27 and July 25, please note that the new pickup location is the First Baptist Church Atlanta. You will receive more information about this new location later.

FUN FACTS ABOUT CBM IN 2019!

- 1 APPROXIMATELY 1,200 BOYS AND GIRLS** will attend Camp Barney this summer from Atlanta, 26 states from coast to coast, and about 10 campers from Israel and France. 91% are returning campers.
- 2 DOZENS OF VERY THOUGHTFUL CAMP BARNEY PARENT REPS** hosted CBM presentations this year in metro Atlanta, Birmingham, Nashville, Charlotte, Tampa, Orlando, Boca Raton, Palm Beach Gardens, Savannah, Columbia, and New Orleans. Todah Rabah!
- 3 400 STAFF WILL ARRIVE IN MAY** (about 1-2 weeks ahead of our first group of campers) to begin training: managing their facilities, supplies and equipment; creating activities, trips, and programs; preparing food service, medical, office, transportation, communication, and technology systems; fully understanding our security and risk management; and learning about every single child.
- 4 ONLINE PHOTOS** this summer: We've assembled multiple photographers who, along with many other CBM staff, will regularly capture awesome photos and videos of campers and post them! Thanks for your feedback—we hope you enjoy the glimpse into some of the magical moments at camp!

- 5 NEW PUBLIC HEALTH COMPANY PARTNERSHIP:** Camp Barney remains annually committed to improving every aspect of our operation. We also listen to, read, and respond to your very thoughtful feedback, from online photos and fresh, new menus to elevated security and bugs. That's right, I said bugs! We have partnered again with Ivy Oaks Analytics, a public health company that specializes in the control of ticks, mosquitos, chiggers, and poison ivy. They currently work with more than 100 other camps on the East Coast and in the Midwest and Southeast. This is a comprehensive, environmentally-friendly, and child-safe method of diminishing the bug populations and poison ivy around CBM. No guarantees, but hopefully, fewer skin issues and happier campers and parents again this summer!
- 6 THE FIRST LETTERS HOME** from your child(ren) will be accessible from your CBM account within a couple of days after they arrive at camp.
- 7 CAMPERS WILL ENJOY EVERYTHING OUR 540 ACRES** have to offer, navigating around two lakes and within view of the North Georgia Blue Ridge Mountains on their way to hundreds of meaningful and exciting activities with their counselors and cabin groups.

- 8 MEALS HAVE BEEN GIVEN A MAKEOVER** and campers will notice lots of tasty choices served on our colorful new dishware for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Milk Line cookies are still provided each night while our iconic and delicious Barney Bars are available every Sunday. Of course, alternative meals and snacks for those requiring special diets are always available.
- 9 WE HAVE MANY SPECIAL EVENTS** this summer! Our full-feature play this summer, *Frozen*, will be performed during the last week of both first and second sessions, in June and July. 10:30 am	ACTIVITY #2	Anything from the cool new "wedge" at The Finn Water Luge, archery, and the Log Roll to fencing, pedal boards, kayaking, golf, and more!
11:45 am	ACTIVITY #3	Another exciting cabin activity!
1:00 pm	LUNCH	Plus lots of singing & cheering after the meal!
1:45 pm	REST HOUR	Write/receive mail (and email) & Canteen (snack).
3:00 pm	ACTIVITY #4	Another exciting cabin activity!
4:15 pm	ACTIVITY #5	Another exciting cabin activity!
5:15 pm	POOL SWIMMING	The pools are open for an awesome late afternoon splash!
6:00 pm	DINNER	Something tasty is always on the menu!
6:45 pm	FREE PLAY	After each dinner, we announce what activities are open for "chugim" or free play—anything from The Hurricane water slide, boating, and arts and crafts to tennis, dance, karate, basketball, and more! Campers have the choice of spending an hour with their cabin, friends in other cabins, or sibling(s).
7:45 pm	ACTIVITY #6	Another exciting cabin activity—oh my gosh, there's more than 400 activities at CBM!
8:45 pm	MILK LINE	Each night before bedtime, campers enjoy warm, freshly baked cookies and milk (or alternatives for special diets). Campers also have time to say good night to siblings and friends.
9:30 pm	LIGHTS OUT (YOUNG CAMPERS)	Before bedtime, campers brush teeth, straighten up the cabin, and talk about the day.
9:30 pm	ACTIVITY #7	Older campers choose a Chug (elective/hobby), anything from theater and sports to arts and crafts, themed cooking "classes," swimming, and more!
11:00 pm	LIGHTS OUT (OLDER CAMPERS)	Supervision is EVERYWHERE for all campers, including in and around every cabin!

2019 CABIN GROUPINGS

HOW DOES THAT WORK?

Let's ask Jim!

"Only one person puts the cabin groups together and that's ME! We don't have a committee or use random methods. It's not by alphabetical order. It's strategic and personal. In addition to everything else you share with us, we read every Bunkmate Request on the Confidential Camper Questionnaire, which you will complete next month. I look at cabin groupings from last summer and review if they were successful. I read many emails and we meet with many families. I try to know as many kids as possible. I honor requests if both campers request each other. I try to keep cabins balanced by combining new campers with returning campers and those from Atlanta with campers from other cities. I consider similar interests, personalities, and needs.

Why are we so detailed and comprehensive about this? Because we want our campers to have the best summer experience! Most of the time our cabin grouping system works out quite well, but we're ready to respond if for any reason it doesn't. The same energy goes into determining which counselors will work best with specific age groups, cabin groups, and various teams of staff."



CHECK OUT THE 2019 FEEL GOOD PAGE

The safety and security of every camper and staff member is paramount at Camp Barney. While there are no guarantees, we annually pursue a very long list of initiatives to exceed existing standards and desired goals. While most of our safety and security measures are “seen,” many are “unseen.” HERE’S OUR TOP 23:

1. Working with all county Emergency Services Professionals including our local sheriff, police department, fire department, EMS, Urgent Care, and others.
2. Exceeding more than 800 standards established annually by the American Camp Association and receiving their highest level of certification each year.
3. Annually achieving the highest level of scores when visited by the White County Health Department, specifically for our entire food service operation and our two swimming pools.
4. Hiring the leaders in the ropes courses and outdoor adventure field to build and certify our courses, as well as a three-day intensive training course for every staff member leading these activities.
5. Requiring approved American Red Cross or other certification in Lifeguard Training (all aquatics and boating staff) and first-aid certification for all aquatics, nature, horseback riding, and sports staff.
6. Other in-service staff workshops pertaining to instruction and safety of major equipment (i.e., kitchen appliances, boating, kilns and potter’s wheels, and mountain bikes).
7. Hiring a Public Health Company that specializes in the control of ticks, mosquitos, chiggers, and poison ivy.
8. Employing a “Mashgiah” to train, manage, and supervise the Kashrut (Kosher) aspect of our food service.
9. Annual inspection and tagging of nearly 300 placed and fixed fire extinguisher systems throughout Camp Barney.
10. Hiring eight physicians and more than 28 nurses who are in-residence throughout the summer.
11. Hiring 6 “Camper Care Team” professionals (psychologists, social workers, and school counselors) who will be in-residence all summer in 2019 to support our staff and campers to have an amazing experience!
12. Managing our modern, state-of-the-art Billi and Bernie Marcus Health Center, a jewel in overnight camps in North America.
13. Engaging LTC Scripts, a company that specializes in customized, individually-wrapped daily pharmacy medicines.
14. Demarcations on all approved staff vehicles.
15. Appropriate helmets on all activities where required (i.e., horseback riding, ropes courses, mountain biking, and whitewater rafting). Routine lice spray between usage.
16. Criminal background checks, references, and personal interviews for all employed staff members.
17. Training for all staff including risk management and emergency action planning pertaining to weather situations, active shooter, fire, etc.
18. Familiarization of neighbors who surround/notice the perimeter of our 540 acres.
19. Expectations of parents that no child will arrive on their first day of camp unhealthy, with fever, contagious, with active lice, with interventions for inappropriate behaviors, anger issues, bullying, exclusion, etc.
20. Signed code of conduct form required of all campers.
21. O.D.’s — On Duty rotations every night by all staff members, positioned at every cabin for additional night time supervision.
22. Our “3 Rules” at Camp Barney Medintz, intended to establish our culture and expectations of all campers and staff to maintain a respectful and safe environment:
 - (1) Respect for all living things (people and animals). No abuse will be tolerated pertaining to physical, emotional, psychological, sexual, harassment of any kind, bullying, teasing, exclusion, etc.
 - (2) Respect for the environment. No abuse will be tolerated pertaining to intentionally damaging our natural environment, camp property, each other’s property.
 - (3) No illegal drugs or alcohol is permitted on CBM property. Other items not permitted by campers are shared in our Parent’s Handbook.

The consequence for breaking any of the above “3 Rules” for staff is dismissal and for campers is likely dismissal.
23. CAMP BARNEY has annually chosen to seek the very best staff, and a rather large number of staff for an excellent ratio and to enable supervision opportunities. Our method of having campers largely experience each activity as a cabin group (versus roaming individually to various activities) supports our intention of having campers be properly supervised throughout their days at Camp Barney.
