

# ABCs of CBM

We want to bring you into the Camp Barney family and culture! This document will help you become familiar with terms that are used at Camp Barney.



<b>3-Day</b>	This is the fun and exciting trip the Alufim (15-year-old) campers take out of camp for 3 days!
<b>6-Day</b>	This is the fun and exciting trip the JIT (16-year-old) campers take out of camp for 6 days!
<b>"Appy"</b>	Appalachian Trail. We take Tsofim (14-year-olds) hiking and camping on this trip for 3 days. The full trail starts in Georgia and goes to the state of Maine.
<b>Barney Bars</b>	Our very own brand of chocolate bars! Campers get these on Sundays in their Canteen. Flavors include Cookies and Cream, Pop Rocks, Caramel, and Smores.
<b>Barneyroo</b>	This is a fun mix between a carnival and talent show. The younger campers come and can go to different and fun booths hosted by Specialist staff. After, the whole camp comes together to enjoy a staff talent show.
<b>Beatles Session</b>	Do you want to know what really happened to Paul McCartney? Here's our myth buster program on the history of the famous UK band.
<b>Birkat Hamazon</b>	Hebrew prayer after eating at the end of meals.
<b>Beetle Fields</b>	This is one of the locations where we go camping with our campers. This is located behind the Teen Village.
<b>Birthdays</b>	Woo Hoo! If you have a birthday at camp, we celebrate you! You'll learn our Birthday song and dance and get lifted in the birthday chair (if you choose to)!
<b>Breakfast Out</b>	A program on your schedule where campers and staff cook their own breakfast instead of eating in our Dining Hall

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<b>Cabin Group</b>	The group that campers live with and spend their days going to activities with. Each cabin group has about 10-12 campers and 2 staff members
<b>Cabin 20</b>	The building where our adult staff with developmental disabilities live - it's located near the staff lounge
<b>Cabin Clean-up</b>	A time after breakfast for campers to clean up their cabin and compete for cleanest cabin award each week
<b>Campouts</b>	Camp strives to instill outdoor living skills and wilderness appreciation. Campers and their counselors spend the night outdoors, setting up their own shelter, and cooking dinner and roasting s'mores over the fire.
<b>Canteen</b>	Snacks that are handed out to campers and staff at Rest Hour. During breakfast, campers and staff fill out a form with their snack choices
<b>Chart Sign Up</b>	Counselors come together with Head Specialists once a week to choose what activities their cabin will be doing
<b>Cheer session</b>	We do these every Saturday! Each unit performs their cheers in the Dining Hall loudly and proudly. When someone says Announcements, there is a cheer everyone does after spelling out the word.
<b>Chugim</b>	Elective activities for Middles that individual campers choose and then participate in for 4 days
<b>Coffeehouse</b>	A talent show specifically for our teen campers, usually done on the final Saturday night of camp.
<b>Color War</b>	A day-long competition that involves all of camp breaking into 4 colors (teams)! Each team is led by staff captains who help campers stay involved and excited throughout the day. The actual date of Color War is a surprise to campers, as is the theme!
<b>Community Care</b>	A team of psychologists and specialists who are here to help kids with emotional support
<b>Crazy Creek</b>	A popular brand of foldable camp chair
<b>Cook Out</b>	Our younger campers go out into our campsites and cook dinner after making a fire! This is their introduction to Campouts in future summers. They then spend the night back in their cabins.
<b>Counselor</b>	These are the staff members who engage with, live with, and ensure safety for campers as they participate in camp activities and spend their time at camp
<b>Dairy Queen</b>	This is an ice cream/food restaurant near camp. Try a delicious Blizzard!

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<b>Division Supervisors</b>	This is a level of support between the Head Specialist/Unit Head and Director. They have a lot of experience at camp and are there to support you and help camp run smoothly. See the Organizational Chart to learn more
<b>Eno</b>	A popular brand of hammock
<b>Fogey's Treehouse</b>	Our awesome treehouse that is up on a hill towards the front of camp (near the Halpern Center). Campers can enjoy this space for programming or just being in nature!
<b>Free Play</b>	Informal free choice of activities for Teens, offered on days when Middles have Chugim
<b>GI</b>	"Group Initiative" teambuilding activities for campers run by our Naturecrafts staff
<b>Hamotzi</b>	Hebrew prayer before eating at the beginning of meals.
<b>Head OD</b>	A Senior Staff member who spends the evening on a Village porch, supervising staff and campers. All staff will sign in for curfew with the Head OD in the village that they live in
<b>Intersession</b>	This is the break between first session (June) and second session (July) where you can rest and relax and come back fully prepared for the final round of campers.
<b>JIT</b>	JITs are the eldest / last year as campers at camp. They are typically 16 years old.
<b>JAFF</b>	JIT staff.
<b>Jillage</b>	JIT Village - where the JIT campers and counselors live
<b>JIT Hill</b>	The JITs used to live at this location. Now it is one of the locations for campouts, mostly for our older age groups of Tsofim and Alufim
<b>Linda's</b>	A truck and petrol stop next to camp with breakfast biscuits.
<b>Little's</b>	The collective term for the youngest units of campers: CBMX, Kochavim, and Moshavim
<b>Kumihimo</b>	A popular bracelet-making arts and crafts activity
<b>Mappy</b>	Short for "Miniature Appy". This is set up to help prepare Chaverim campers (13- year-olds) with the skills needed for Appy the following summer. It is an in-camp hike and they go camping on the back side of the property.

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<b>Middles</b>	Collective term for the middle units of campers: Shomrim, Giborim, and Chaverim
<b>Milestone years</b>	3, 5, 7, 10, and 12 years! When campers and staff have stayed this long they receive a specialized t-shirt, sweater, or jacket!
<b>Milkline</b>	Nightly milk and cookies for everyone
<b>Mo Parties</b>	Dance parties on the Moadon, the teen village porch
<b>OD</b>	"On Duty". In order for all of us to enjoy the time-off at night, all counselors and specialists share the responsibility of supervising the campers 1-2 nights per week.
<b>Oneg</b>	Unit programs on Shabbat led by Unit Heads and counselors. They happen Friday nights (typically values themed), Saturday morning (typically Jewish themed), and Saturday night (typically social/fun themed)
<b>Off days</b>	Time off! You usually get about 30 hours off per week to rest, relax, and recharge.
<b>Onegs</b>	Unit-wide Shabbat programs that connect campers to Jewish values. Typically, these happen on Friday night, Saturday Morning and Saturday night.
<b>Order Packer</b>	Located between the Dining Hall and the Halpern Pool. This is where counselors and specialists pick up supplies for campouts and trips
<b>Period</b>	A one hour block of time for participating in activities or programs. The daily schedule has 7-8 periods
<b>Rafter Ball</b>	This is a game played in the bunks that has no real rules but it is something that people love and look forward to
<b>Rover</b>	A staff member who 'rotates' around a unit filling in for counselors on periods and days off. Rovers have the awesome opportunity to meet and connect with many different campers in the unit.
<b>Sababa</b>	Sababa means "cool" in Hebrew. At CBM, Sababa is a Specialty Area where campers experience Israeli Culture.
<b>Shabbat</b>	The Jewish day of rest from Friday night through Saturday night. We celebrate this at camp with an alternate schedule and programming
<b>Shabbat Concert</b>	Talent show hosted by staff with campers performing. It's the evening program on the final Saturday night of camp.
<b>SOLO</b>	Our JITS participate in this program, where they spend the day alone at a site on our property. The timing of this is a surprise. Once SOLO is announced by JIT staff,

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	campers then have 15 minutes to gather their supplies and be ready to head into the woods.
<b>Song Session</b>	Designated campwide session of singing and dancing (typically after lunch) with song leaders in the Dining Hall
<b>Specialist</b>	A staff member who “specializes” in running and facilitating activities for campers in a fun, creative, engaging, and safe way.
<b>Staff Auction</b>	An auction (silent and live) of various camp memorabilia on the final night of camp. Money raised goes toward staff scholarship (see description below)
<b>Staff Scholarship</b>	Staff honor voted on by all of staff. Award presented after staff auction and \$\$ raised from auction is divided among winners of staff scholarship
<b>Sunflower</b>	A local Chinese restaurant- we take staff here for a late-night meal once a session!
<b>TED</b>	Trip and Expedition Deck. Located outside the Dining Hall, this is where campers wait to depart on trips
<b>Teens</b>	The collective term for the oldest units of campers: Tsofim, Alufim, and JIT
<b>Teen Dock</b>	Dock on the teen side of Lake Wendy. Located in front of the Babbit Center.
<b>Thorguard</b>	Our lightning detection system. It detects when the conditions for lightning are present and how dangerous or safe those conditions are.
<b>Trio</b>	A 24-hour three-person campout for Alufim campers
<b>Trip Kits</b>	Medical/First Aid kit that is taken on trips and includes camper prescriptions.
<b>UC</b>	Unit, or Assistant Counselor assigned to cabin groups
<b>Unit</b>	Division of campers based on grade
<b>Unit Head</b>	A head staff member who supervises all the counselors, rovers, and campers in a unit
<b>Village</b>	Areas of camp where campers live. Village 1 is coed for the youngest Littles, Village 2 is all-female for some Little and all Middle campers. Village 3 is all-male for some Little and all Middle campers. Teen Village is coed for all Teen campers except JITs
<b>Waiters</b>	2 campers from each cabin set tables for their cabin group before meals
